Covid-19's effect on brain raises fears of long-term global health burden

Scientists are trying to understand cause of neurological problems and whether symptoms will last

COVID LONG (or PASC) - follow-up

There are currently 16,188 scientific articles listed in the PubMed database (National Institute of Health-USA Library) and 240 published in 2022 that deal with COVID LONG and brain.

The Financial Times article of 19 May reports results published in Nature ² obtained by comparing brain imaging (MRI) of 785 people of whom 401 were COVID positive (with or without severe symptoms).). In comparison to the images before and after infection with COVID reveals marked differences between those infected with COVID and those not infected.

In particular, i) a decrease in grey matter thickness in 2 brain regions (orbitofrontal cortex and parahippocampal gyrus), ii) greater changes in tissue damage markers in regions connected to the olfactory cortex and iii) a greater reduction in brain size. Infected participants also showed a greater cognitive decline.

BBC-NBCs-National Brain Plan





On 10 May, the 8th Academy of National Brain Councils was held at the Bavarian Permanent Representation to the European Union. Among the participants were the presidents of the National Brain Councils of Germany (Ulrike Shara-Schmidt), France (Philippe Gorwood), Belgium (Laurence Ris), Norway (Henrik Peersen), Spain (Mara Driessens), Greece (represented by Nikolaos Grigoriadis) and Serbia (Pavle Andjus).

The agenda focused on the National Brain and Mental Health Plans. Three countries (Germany, Norway and Belgium) presented the status of their plans. It emerged from the Academy's discussions that a Brain Plan template should be prepared and submitted to the various NBCs in order to have, despite the heterogeneity of the Member States' public health policies, a coherent project to submit to the European Commission, which is ready to support a Brain Plan project as it did for the Cancer Plan.




